Seattle Shores Welcomes New Member

She walked in the Seattle Shores door in May, 2010 and related later that she immediately felt at home in her new chorus!! Jeanne McNeil was born in Flint, Michigan to an airline pilot father and an interior designer mother. The oldest of four children, she learned to live in a musical world from the very beginning. Both parents were singers and Jeanne and her siblings sang also.

Jeanne went to a private boarding academy and took voice lessons in high school also singing in the choir. (When she was in the 8th grade in Illinois, the mother of one of her classmates sang barbershop. She chose four 8th graders and formed a quartet to sing for graduation. Thus, Jeanne's first quartet was established for one performance.)

In college, Jeanne sang in a travelling choir. Her first husband was a voice major but Jeanne didn't join Sweet Adelines until after her second marriage. In the mid-1980's she joined *Choral-Aires Chorus* but dropped out for a while. (In 1990, she returned to *Choral-Aires* and stayed until


she retired in 1999.) She then joined a little chorus in Florida called *Fever*. Another chorus was in the area, *City of Palms*, but as often happens, the two choruses weren't on the best of terms. Karen Breidert, an accomplished director decided a merger should happen and after considerable effort and mediation, there was a merger of these two choruses and the group now known as *Spirit of the Gulf Chorus* was chartered in 2000. Jeanne, whose background as a labor relations and staff development supervisor for United Airlines, was very involved on the "merger team" and continues her contact with members of *Spirit of the Gulf Chorus* today.

Jeanne graduated with a bachelor's degree in Elementary Education from Andrews University in Michigan; taught remedial reading and elementary education in the primary grades and then moved to English literature in high school to complete her 8 year teaching career. She later earned a master's degree in

education from Adelphi, University in New York City. She worked in labor relations and the training of new-hires flight attendants for United Airlines, retiring in 1999. She and her 2nd husband, Eddie, left Fort Myers, Florida in 2006 and moved to the Seattle area. Eddie, 25 years her senior, had suffered a stroke in 1999 causing the move to Ft. Myers. He suffered a 2nd stroke in 2006 and passed away some nine months later.

The grandmother of six grandchildren, (four boys and 2 girls) Jeanne has a son, Scott, in the Seattle area and daughter, Stacey in northern Illinois. In Sweet Adelines, she has sung some lead, baritone most of her affiliation and now loving bass. She finds the women in the Seattle Shores Chorus hard working and loves the smaller chorus because it is an opportunity to get to know everyone. She also loves the fact that everyone is working to improve their barbershop skills. Jeanne states she has found her home and is very glad to be a part of Seattle Shores.
